Monthly Summary

In a bid to streamline the operations furthermore, the DSWT desnaring teams were re-organized during the end of October/beginning of November period. These changes involved both personnel (team embers and leaders), their area of operation as well naming of the Teams. Hence each team earned a new name; For a start, the Faru team, formerly Bura, pre-occupied itself with groundwork (reconnaissance etc) during part of the month and thereafter joined its closest team, no known as Simba Team (formerly Ziwani) for joint work. Substantial realizations were made with the teams making numerous visits to the nearby community ranches as well as patrolling the Park from which several snares were lifted and two arrests were made. The team aims to build strong relationships with KWS on the ground, and have KWS Rangers as back-up for more efficiency during Patrols.


