Monthly Summary

The month of October was a busy month following the long drought affecting the wildlife in the parks within the TCA (Tsavo Conservation Area). During patrols at Maktau the team found a fresh elephant carcass, both tusks were missing. The elephants in this area are vulnerable as they have been gathering around the only remaining water sources which makes them a known target to poachers.

On 9th of October the team relocated to Ithumba to give backup due to increasing poaching incidences being reported. The team worked in joint effort with the Ithumba team, and managed to arrest 3 poachers and 2 loggers. Patrols there also resulted in the removal of more than 50 snares. On the 24th the team went back to Voi and operated in Ngutuni where 14 medium snares were lifted.
