Monthly Summary

During the first week of the month, the team patrolled Sagalla ranch which yielded the highest number of snares lifted during the course of the month. The team got information of the whereabouts of the poacher's entry and exit route and upon reaching this area, many recently laid snares were found. The Team laid ambush and managed to arrest one poacher while coming to check on his snares. The poacher was arrested in possession of five kilograms of game meat, 18 small snares and two knives; he was booked at Voi Police Station.

On visiting Mbulia ranch, the team noted that poaching and charcoal burning activities are taking place. While on the other side of Ndii area, the snaring seems to have decreased. This could have been attributed to the fact that the team has been vigilant in this area over the last few months, hence making it difficult for the poachers to replace snares without them being picked up by the team.

On the 13th of the month, the team relocated to Dakota and its general area whereby logging and charcoal burning have been seen as a one of the main illegal activities taking place. Illegal cattle grazing inside the Park area is another major problem that needs to be addressed. On patrolling Ngutuni ranch, the team came across an elephant snare which is made using six inches nails and it was put on elephant trails. The Team suspects that the nails have been smeared with poison so that the elephants stepping on it will die quicker.

As this is the last report for the year of 2011 the Team would like to extend their gratitude to all those who support The David Sheldrick Wildlife Trust, because without this support the project would not be possible. The Team would also like to thank KWS (Kenya Wildlife Service) for all the hard work they have carried out in collaboration this year and for their dedication to the Anti-poaching patrols with the DSWT. We look forward to working together in 2012 and hope we can continue to make such a valuable difference in protecting Kenya's wildlife & natural resources.
