Monthly Summary

The team resumed from 14 days off-duty on 16th February 2011. Work commenced as usual with the first day being a joint patrol with the Kenze team whilst subsequent patrols were executed from Utu base. The team's operations were boosted by an aerial survey whose follow-up saw 3 charcoal burners being arrested. Two illegal cattle grazers were caught a few days later as well as 6 miraa harvesters.

Generally, there was a notable decline in the level of illegal activities within the park; perhaps an indicator the teams' ongoing efforts. However, worthy noting is the fact the patterns – time in particular seemed to have changed drastically; with most illegal activities being carried out at unusual hours in an effort to avoid the Team capturing and arresting offenders. Of course this then becomes trickier to tackle but efforts are being made to adapt to the evolving challenges.
