Monthly Summary

During the month of May the team revisited Utu and Kikunduku areas. Last month these areas had registered a high number of arrests. Upon re-visiting the area, 1 charcoal burner was arrested around Utu and 2 more were arrested at Kikunduku area.

The team returned to Kenze to release the team that was due to take some time off. While based there the team visited, Tindima, Metava, Mundi and Kenzili areas. 4 Wood carvers with 20 snares were arrested at Mindi, 2 charcoal burners with 10 snares were arrested at Metava, and 3 wood carvers were arrested at Tindima. Several snares were lifted at Umani, indicating that snaring peak period has started and hence the Team expects more bush meat arrests to be witnessed as the year progresses.

Two schools benefitted with a school trip to Tsavo West National Park. The trips took place on 11th and 12th May 2011 respectively. They included Kithasyo and Kyandulu primary schools. The kids were very excited to see wildlife in a natural environment, especially the elephants. The second phase of the fence line project around Kibwezi forest is complete and operational. The community members are very grateful to the Trust for this gesture. The third phase is now in progress.
