Monthly Summary

This month's patrols were a follow up of the previous months work. The Team revisited areas with water as this is where poachers tend to seek out the wildlife, especially for big game as the animals come to drink water. In every waterhole the Team visited there was either a shooting platform or fresh poacher's footprints. From the information the Team is gathering, the poachers are visiting these areas either during the latter hours of the day or at night.

The Team camped at the power line where most of the waterholes are concentrated and managed to arrest a notorious elephant poacher with 28 poisoned arrows, 2 bows and 28 snares of which 4 were for big game. He had recently come out from prison after serving 11 years jail sentence after killing 3 elephants at Tundani area Tsavo northern area way back in the year 2002. His accomplice managed to escape; this man has been poaching for 25 years and has never been arrested. After interrogating the arrested poacher he informed the Team that there are around 10 poachers visiting the water holes daily, all of whom are only interested in big game. He even confessed that they sometimes use furidan which is a lethal pesticide to put in the waterholes when the water is almost dry in order to kill elephants. This information was confirmed towards the last week of May when two poachers ate elephant meat inside the park unaware that it had the lethal poison. One of them died instantly while the other poacher is fighting for his life in hospital.

During the second week operations the Team moved to the Gazi area where there was rampant charcoal burning inside the park. The Team managed to arrest 3 charcoal burners/poachers in this area in possession of 12 small snares. They had already cut most of the big trees along the Athi River and were found moving deep inside the park. There was an also illegal cattle grazing inside the park. A lot of consistent patrols and pressure is required in this area to deter these illegal activities. The Team lifted nearly 30 snares at Buffalo-bent which is a hot spot for poaching.
