Monthly Summary

The team resumed patrols on the 15th of November following 2 weeks off duty. There was a further drop in the illegal activities inside the park compared to last month. This could be attributed to the rainy season when illegal activities tend to go down. However the Team did find some illegal charcoal burning at Kyamanyenze and Gazi areas. At Gazi area the Team destroyed more than 20 bags of charcoal ready for market inside the park. The Team also recovered a pair of tusks from a decomposed elephant carcass at Gazi area; the tusks were handed over to KWS.

Most of the roads were rendered impassable after the heavy rains experienced at the Tsavo northern area. This hindered patrols as some sections were completely inaccessible.

The opening of the new road at the Yatta area continued as planned. However re-supplying the casuals doing the work with food rations and water has been at times difficult due to the flooded river Tiva.
