Monthly Summary

During the month of April the team began its patrols around the Kilalinda Wildlife Conservancy, and the surrounding community. Some of the highlights include four large snares lifted at Kilalinda wildlife conservancy, these snares most likely targeted buffalo for the commercial game meat trade, unfortunately a young elephant was caught by one of the snares and the Team found its carcass.

The second half of the month was dominated by the team advancing the patrols further to Kambu area along the Kambu River and Likoni area. Several small snares were recovered which were freshly set, indicating that the likely culprits are those people who are living within the community reserve.

On 20th of April the Mtito team took some time off during which Peregrine team continued with the daily patrols around the Trustland area. Currently most patrols are carried out as a joint effort with Peregrine Team.
