Upon resuming duty the team found out that charcoal burning activities were rampant, especially in the Mange'lete area; therefore directed much of its efforts to tackle this problem and thanks to relentless efforts by the Team, there has been a reduction of charcoal kilns in the hotspot areas. Also on the decline is the number of snares being lifted in the Teams area of operation which reflects upon the hard work carried out and means that the animals safer.

The team managed to host three video shows attracted a huge audience meaning that people are really embracing the outreach that we are carrying out.
