The month marked the end of the teams patrol in the Triangle area as the team relocated permanently to the Ithumba area on the 21st of this month. Nevertheless the team had already carried out serious patrols in this area which culminated in the arrest of sixteen men who had wet bush meat with them. The team came across an elephant carcass in the Triangle area whose tusk had been pulled off.

Two schools namely Ngiluni and Nooka Primary schools were taken out on ecological trips and the kids were very excited as they interacted with the wildlife at Tsavo west. The team was also invited at Kiundwani primary school where the team gave out the positive message of conservation to the parents who were very attentive.

As the Team is relocated to the North of Tsavo, the members of Mtito Team would like to look back with a lot of pride and confidently say that a good job within the teams assigned areas of operation havs been carried out. This work could not be achieved without the help of everyone involved, hence a big thank you to the KWS fraternity, Mr. Richard Moller, our informers and the general community that has been a part of the Teams work.
