The team resumed duty on the 18th of this month. The team was in very high spirits and managed to cover a large area and tackle the prevailing illegal activities such as snaring, bird poaching and charcoal burning. Of great concern was the finding of an elephant carcass within the Triangle which had its tusks missing. The team conducted an aerial patrol which helped a great deal in spotting the areas with illegal activities taking place. The team carried out several night patrols as most of the illegal activities are being done at night. The Team's ongoing Community Outreach project is bearing fruits as more people are volunteering information concerning the park offenders and this enabled the team to catch many people during the month.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

The team leader attended a Chief's Baraza at the Mtito Andei market and had the chance of conveying the message of conservation to the locals. Two schools namely Kambili Primary school and lvingoni secondary were taken on an ecological trip to the Park on the 19th and 20th of this month respectively. The students could not hide their joy as they got a chance to experience the National Park for the 1st time. The team enlightened them on the various aspects of wildlife such as flora and fauna and also the physical features in Tsavo West. The team also attended a sports day at Mtito Andei Primary school.
