

Monthly Summary

Ndovu team report for Oct-2013 Areas patrolled were; Kalovoto, Kasala, Tundani, Sheldrick blind and Athi.

Findings

Kalovoto

The team resumed work on the 3rd of the month by visiting Kalovoto area which is adjacent to the Ithumba Base on the northern side of the park. Upon receiving some rainfall, the area became green quickly and many herds of elephants were attracted in this area because of this. This made the team to thoroughly patrol the general area for ten days to disrupt poacher's movement. As a result of this, the team lifted 10 medium snares which looked inactive and also destroyed an old shooting platform near Kanziku fence line.

Kasala

Being an area adjacent to the community land on the northern side of the Park, the team extensively patrolled the area along the fence line from Kimweli area towards Gazi gate with 177 small and 18 medium snares were lifted and four snared dikdik carcasses found. The team then tried to lay an ambush on several occasions but to no avail. Cases of logging and illegal cattle grazing were also sighted taking place in this area and team will again visit the area next month to monitor the situation on the ground.

Tundani

Tundani area is on the western side of the Ithumba base. This was sighted as a hotspot poaching area this month with two elephants carcasses found with their tusks cut off. Both carcasses were sighted by DSWT pilot on an air patrol. One carcass looked very fresh and the pilot alerted the team. Jointly with the KWS Canine Unit the team patrolled the area where two poacher's footprints were sighted and tracked them for more than 20 kilometers. The trail grew cold since the foot prints crossed over into the community land.

Sheldrick blind

Sheldrick blind is an area situated on the slopes of Yatta plateau near the Tharakana air strip. This area was patrolled on for two days and the team found a recently used shooting blind and sighted three poachers' footprints. The team followed the footprints till the top of the Yatta plateau until the footprints were sighted crossing over River Athi to the community area.

Athi

The team then visited this area for five consecutive days whereby patrols were done down and upstream of the River Athi and the team managed to lift a total of 72 assorted snares and also found an old elephant carcass with tusks missing. The team believed that the poacher's used the snare to kill the animal.




