

Monthly Summary

NDOVU TEAM REPORT FOR APRIL 2013

Areas patrolled:

- Tundani
- · Lesilau Dam
- · Kasala fence line.

Findings

On the 8th of the month, the team got information that a baby elephant was sighted alone at Tundani area by our pilot who was on regular air patrol. The team, together with the elephant keepers hurriedly rushed to the area and found a baby elephant which is eight month old and looked very confused and we rescued her and later airlifted to Nairobi elephant orphanage. The team suspected that the baby's mother had been poached as several elephant poachers have been arrested within the vicinity few months ago.

The team carried out its normal operations only for eleven days during the course of the month, due to a shortage of KWS rangers. This is due to an operation taking place on the eastern side of the Park. Upon getting rangers, the team thoroughly patrolled Tundani area for six consecutive days whereby several shooting blinds built near the water holes were destroyed and the team arrested two notorious elephant poachers in the area. These Wakamba Tribesmen were in possession of:

- · 11 poisoned arrows
- 2 bows
- 2 knives
- 1 axe
- 40 small snares
- 2KGS of bushmeat
- · Cooking utensils and maize flower

The poachers revealed to the team that they are the main ones who are poaching the elephants within the area and in fact one of them was recently out of jail due to a poaching offence. They were booked at Voi Police Station. Lesilau Dam area was visited where an old shooting blind was found and destroyed.

The team patrolled Kasala fence line towards Tiva River with only logging sighted taking place and also an old shooting blind found and destroyed

Next month the team will focus on patrolling the major water holes in the Park to put more pressure on poachers who target the elephants while drinking water.




