

De-Snaring Report for March, 2013

Monthly Summary

Nyati Team Desnaring Report for March 2013.

The team began its operation on the 13th of the month due to shortage of rangers on the beginning of the month. The team first patrolled Tundani general area for three consecutive days whereby several shooting blinds were destroyed and also found a snared elephant carcass with the tusks missing. The team believes that the animal could have been poached a few months ago. The team sighted bicycles tracks crossing in and outside of the Park and several ambushes were laid but no arrests were made. The team then did their patrols in Gazi area towards river Athi, where two men who were trying to lay snares and were charcoal burning at the same time were arrested and booked at Kibwezi Police Station. A snared leopard carcass was found and several charcoal kilns were destroyed. The team noted that poaching and charcoal burning was the two major illegal activities in that area. Around Kalovoto area, the team lifted three old snares and destroyed an old shooting blind. Five medium snares were found and three poacher's footprints sighted around Power line area. The foot prints were followed till they cross into the community land. At the beginning of the month, the team assisted the Vet Unit to treat three elephants which had severe arrow wounds here at the stockade water point and also found a hyena carcass believed to be killed by elephants at the mud bath. Tiva area was patrolled but illegal activities were not found.




